Budding Businesspeople!

Over the past year, many of our Year 11 students have chosen to join our ground-breaking Business Mentoring scheme.

The programme pairs each Year 11 with a mentor from a local business who works with them to develop their unique skills and qualities to increase their employability, foster their creativity and improve on their business sense. The young people involved in the programme are thoroughly enjoying their first taste of the business world.

All of the students who took part in the programme felt that the experience had built their confidence substantially, saying "it has made me more organised and prepared me for the world of work". The pupils felt they had especially benefited from interacting with their mentor as a colleague, saying the scheme had "given me the confidence to speak to people in a professional context". This is key as, along with giving our young people the business skills necessary for working in a professional environment, we are also helping them to develop the 'people skills' that are essential in the world of work. One said that "whenever I needed my mentor, he was there" and this extra support at one of the most important stages of a child's education is another of the highlights of the programme. Amongst the many other benefits of the initiative, the pupils told us that they had found their mentors' advice and time management tips particularly valuable.

But it isn't just the pupils who have benefitted from the programme; all of the business mentors and their companies have responded very positively and have produced outstanding results in their work with our students. The businesses involved are all members of the Burnley Bondholders scheme, which aims to improve the quality of life in, and the reputation of, the local community. Their social media campaigns are gaining online prominence through the hashtag #BrilliantBurnley as they aim to show the world all the wonderful things going on in our area. Through this initiative, both the individual students and the school as a whole have been privileged enough to work with such organisations as PM&M Accountants, Creative Talent Management Ltd, and Forbes Solicitors.

Due to the overwhelmingly positive feedback, we are currently liaising with several local businesses with a view to running the programme again in the next academic year. Our participating Year 11s are also encouraging Year 10s to sign up for the scheme, saying "it is a really good experience" and "definitely get a mentor if you can".

The initiative has been a resounding success for both the mentors and mentees, and with it being described as "the most useful experience I have had in my school career", we have no doubt that all our young businessmen and women will go on to achieve great things.

But why take our word for it? Hear it from a mentor below:

"As an employee of a company which is a committed and active member of the Burnley Bondholder programme, as well as a parent of two children at Shuttleworth College, the opportunity to support the collaboration between the college and the bondholders in the form of a mentoring project was something I simply could not turn down.

In my role as an independent financial adviser with a strong business development focus, I am a firm believer in metaphorically flying the flag of the firm I work for and myself in equal measure. The result of this is that I am well connected in the local business community and so to be allocated a Year 11 student who is academically strong but also looking to build profile to differentiate himself from his peers was something I felt entirely suited to help him achieve.

Over a number of weeks we have worked together and developed the concept of being 'interested and interesting' by building a professional twitter account for him and connecting with the local business community, including some of the biggest marketing agencies, employers and their HR directors in the region. We have considered charity projects he could involve himself in which have led to detailed discussions on altruism, philanthropy, and corporate social responsibility. I have been able to provide hints and tips on time-planning and emphasise the importance of maintaining his creative side as well as the principle of enjoying and being engaged in whatever comes next. With regards to what comes next we have also worked together in discussing further education opportunities and alternate pathways to follow.

In short, I feel the mentoring programme has given me as a mentor just as much, if not more, than it has given my mentee. I know that from conversations with other mentors, including one of my own colleagues, they would echo this sentiment. Well done, Shuttleworth College, and well done, Burnley Bondholders – this is why the hashtag #BrilliantBurnley continues to gain momentum."
