

Dear Families,

We are really looking forward to seeing year 10 next week. As I said last week there is a lot of information to take in and at the moment as there are many rules and restrictions around what we can do. It is a nightmare for me to keep up with and I am doing it everyday, it will be even harder for you all!

I just wanted to clarify a few things we have been asked over the past couple of days to save you going back through all the information:

- Students are being invited in in small groups due to restrictions on numbers allowed in each day.
- We are running these tutorial style sessions Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday next week AND the week beginning 6th July - there are three zones running each day with staggered start and finish times. Details for the second day in school will be sent out after next week.
- The weeks of 29th June and 13th July we are running some one to one sessions in schools for specific children through our special educational needs team and English as an additional Language team. Families involved in this will be contacted individually.
- There is no school bus running at this time, we will review this for September.
- Students will get a chance to flag concerns around individual subjects on the day and we will plan follow up with them after. This will be phone calls from subject teachers, additional resources or hopefully some subject tutorials on Microsoft teams - we are trying to set this up at the moment.
- On the day of the session your child just needs to bring themselves; a drink, a snack and a pen will be provided.
- Please do not arrive too early as we will not be able to let you in the building until just before you allotted time.

If you have any other queries about next week please don't hesitate to ring or email. I know this is very challenging for all of us as we try to take some steps forward in this crisis. It will look and feel very different in school whilst we have social distancing in place but we will still be thrilled to see more children in school and see how things can look going forward to September.

Just a final polite reminder to avoid coming in to school as a parent if at all possible. We are currently looking after between 30 and 40 key worker children per day and are running similarly tight routines on the ground floor of school. This means we cannot let any visitors in to reception at this time.
