Mathematics

Pearson GCSE Mathematics 1MA1

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Year 11 receive 3 x 2 hour lessons a week in maths. We have designed a one year curriculum for these students, differentiated by target grades, ensuring all aspects of the curriculum are covered by the time they get to May. Students receive homework fortnightly and prep work fortnightly. Homework is mixed skills checks for all students, and preparation work is exam questions based on 1 to 2 topics each time. Students are expected to access both through SMHW, but they can also obtain a hard copy of preparation work if they want this. All homework and preparation is kept in a separate homework book.

Students complete fortnightly walking talking mocks, where we give them a past paper and go through the questions and methods to obtain the correct answer. Students are then given chance to revise this paper at home, coming back to lesson a few days to a week later to sit a very similar paper, where the methods to the questions are exactly the same, they just have to apply this to different numbers. Where there is a break to this routine, students complete an unseen paper, where we haven't gone through it before in class, promoting independence and confidence to tackle the paper when faced with unfamiliar questions.

Is a revision guide needed?

We strongly encourage the use of an online platform called "Mathswatch" for students to revise from. All students have their username and password, and they can access videos, interactive questions, and worksheets from here to aid their revision. This is our number one resource for revision.

We do also have revision guides on sale through parent pay, which are £4, however these are not essential. If you do wish to buy one, please ensure your child knows which tier they will be sitting.

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

Over half term we will be setting some work through SMHW and Mathswatch for Year 11 students to complete. We would like to see students practising their maths little and often, rather than for one large chunk of time over the two week period.

Students have an unseen paper to complete in the first week back after the half term break, so the work set will be around a variety of topics to give them a wide coverage of aspects of the curriculum. This will involve watching videos on maths watch, completing interactive questions on Mathswatch, and then some activities to complete on paper.

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Art, Craft and Design

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Following changes made by the exam board on reflection of disruptions, students ARE NOT required to complete the externally assessed art exam element this year.

Therefore the grade for **GCSE Art, Craft and Design** will be awarded **solely based on the portfolio element** of the course- their '**Close Up**' project from Year 10 and their **current major project** (Messages/Crowded/Concealment).

It is therefore imperative that this work meets the highest standards of which pupils are capable and is completed in full if they are to achieve a grade fully reflective of their abilities.

The deadline for completion of the major project is 26th March 2021. Students will then have the opportunity to review and refine other elements of their portfolio before the final deadline for submission on 23rd April 2021.

Is a revision guide needed?

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

Students have all been issued with a success criteria that details the order and requirements for each element of the major project. They should continue with their project over half term, spending a minimum of 2-4 hours on relevant activities in their sketchbook.

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Theory: **50% of final grade**

Two hours per fortnight. Assessed through mock exams. Supported by weekly revision workbook homework tasks as per homework calendar issued to pupils.

NEA: **50% of total grade**: Six hours per fortnight.

Pupils have begun their NEA (non-exam assessment) portfolio task in lessons via OneDrive. This is worth 50% of their final grade and as such, every pupil should aim to attain the highest standard possible in each section of the NEA. This can be accessed at home and pupils should be continuing and completing work as set in class, ensuring they meet the deadlines below. It is essential each section is completed by each deadline if pupils are to have the quantity and depth of work to allow them to complete the following stage.

Section A: Identifying and investigating design possibilities: Deadline 25th September

Section B: Producing a design brief and specification: Deadline 9th October

Section C: Generating design ideas: Deadline 20th November

Section D: Developing design ideas: Deadline 22nd January 2021

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Geography

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

For the remainder of the year Y11s will be completing the last Unit 1 and Unit 2 topics, then students will study fieldwork techniques as they will have to answer questions on 'applied' fieldwork in their exam, finally they will study the Issue Evaluation document that the exam board sends to school in March.

Home learning is based on the work we are currently doing in class, 'Preparation' tasks are based on topics we are revising in Intervention lessons.

Students have recently done their end of unit assessment for River as a 'walking talking mock'. Subsequent end of unit assessments will be unseen assessments.

Is a revision guide needed?

All students have been given a CGP revision guide (the green one) and they should be using this on a weekly basis for home learning and preparation.

Mrs Harwood will arrange an order in school for copies if anyone does not have one.

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

Students will be given some exam-style questions to answer based on the Urban (Manchester) unit of work they have been studying in class. They will also be asked to study the key terms relating to Tropical Rainforests.

Students may be given additional tasks by their class teacher.

Students may also spend some additional time on self-guided study in geography, making their own revision materials for whichever topics they feel least confident in.

Students will not be required to complete their own fieldwork in geography this year. However, this section of the exam has not been removed, instead, students will be expected to apply their learning on fieldwork to other contexts.

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

History

Pearson GCSE History 1HI0 (FN)

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Our History exam board EDEXCEL, have issued guidance stating the students only need to complete three examined topics instead of the usual four. This is in light of this year's exceptional circumstances. Consequently, we will complete teaching our third and this year final unit Superpower Relations and the Cold War by Christmas.

We will assess students in November on the Cold War as a mid-unit assessment and then students will complete a full three exam Mock in January. We will use the gained time from February to July to focus on exam questions and revision.

Is a revision guide needed?

Students do not need to purchase a revision guide. All students are given booklets for each history unit we study. These are pre-prepared by us and contain all the information they will need for the exam. We use these in class whilst studying the unit and then students can take them home to revise from.

If your child would like to purchase a revision guide then one of the better ones is ***My Revision Notes: Pearson Edexcel GCSE (9-1) History: Four units in one.*** This is available on Amazon but please remind students that they are only revising the 3 units we have covered for the exam! In addition, there is a series of revision cards available, also on Amazon, should your child prefer to revise in this way.

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

Y11 history students will be given two guided revision booklets similar to the ones we have completed in class to complete over October half term. They will focus on the Hungarian Uprising and the building of the Berlin Wall to consolidate learning done in class.

These revision booklets will be brought back to school and self-assessed in class to ensure that students have accurately revised. This is in readiness for a practice exam on the Cold War up to 1961 in November.

Students have access to additional revision tools such as SENECA, KAHOOT and GCSE Pod clips. We have used these regularly over the past few years and are great to supplement and support the revision set in school.

Hospitality and Catering

WJEC Level 1/2 Award in Hospitality & Catering 5569QA

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Students are currently studying for **Unit 2** of the course: '**Hospitality & Catering in Action**', worth 60% of the final grade. This is the coursework element of the qualification and is split into theory and practical lessons, resulting in the compilation of a mock coursework project prior to the submitted coursework beginning in February.

Theory: (Two hours per week)

AC1: 'Understand the importance of nutrition when planning menus'

AC2: 'Understand menu planning'.

Homework is set in relation to these components.

Practical: (Two hours per week)

AC3: 'Be able to cook dishes'.

Practical sessions will begin after October half term. Students will practice an array of high skilled dishes such as pasta making, filleting fish, portioning chicken, pastry making etc.

Teaching and mock coursework will continue until **February 2021**. After this the submitted coursework will commence with a deadline of **26th March 2021**.

Students re-sitting **Unit 1: Hospitality & Catering Industry** (examination) will begin revision sessions after the Easter break ready to re-sit the exam in **June 2021**.

Is a revision guide needed?

Your child should already have a revision guide which includes information needed for Unit 2. However, if this has been lost it is available from Amazon and is called:

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

Students should be completing tasks associated with their mock coursework.

The instructions will be on Show My Homework but they will complete the mock coursework on OneDrive (accessible through their school email address on www.office.com firstnamelastname16@shuttleworth.lancs.sch.uk)

Students will have questions to answer to ensure they meet all parts of the assessment criteria and they should spend 2 hours on it a week.

If possible, your child should also be practising cooking and baking dishes that require skill, i.e. pastry making, roux sauces, set and baked cheesecake, gelatinised deserts such as panna cotta. More importantly they should practice presenting and garnishing dishes; even if they simply plated up tea every night to practice how to present dishes to make them look appetising and photographable.

Any other relevant info?

Please note – Unit 2 that is being completed this year is worth 60% of their overall grade. Whilst students have a grade for Unit 1 this is only worth 40% so the work being completed now is extremely important.

Music

Eduqas GCSE Music C660QS

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Our initial focus will be on completing coursework, specifically one solo performance and one piece of composition. These should be completed before Christmas.

Whilst this is being taught we will also be revising and developing the pupil's knowledge of the listening units musical forms and devices and popular music.

In the second term we will focus almost entirely on the listening exam. Firstly revising and developing the pupil's knowledge of music for ensemble and film music. We will also be developing the pupil's exam technique by using walking talking mocks.

Homework will initially alternate between practicing exam style listening questions, solo practice and composition research.

After Christmas we will focus entirely on preparing for the listening exam.

Is a revision guide needed?

There are two available for music and both are equally as good and will greatly help with exam preparation.

Physical Education (GCSE)

Pearson GCSE Physical Education 1PE0

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Teaching of new content scheduled to be completed by Christmas. Students well on track for this. After Christmas, the re-visiting of topics that were studied in Year 9.

New topics delivered this year to be tested in class.

Revision to begin in the lessons (selected exam questions that are AO1, AO2 and AO3-specific progressing to full past papers predominantly with the inclusion of knowledge organisers) from January. Walking/talking mocks to help prep students for their Y11 mock exam in January and any other assessments that form evidence for AC2 and AC3 as the year progresses.

Homework throughout the year is written (Week A) and preparation (Week B). Written tasks are from differentiated menus per half term that look at last lesson, last term and last year with a view to making links back to learning points within the theory specification.

Is a revision guide needed?

There are two for GCSE PE (both official Pearson products). The Revision Guide (£6) and Revision Workbook (£6) - where students apply knowledge exam questions per topic.

ParentPay to be set up in November for students to buy.

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

There will be a booklet/document handed to students prior to half term and it will also be uploaded on Show My Homework. This needs to be completed fully over half term.

As a guide, they should spend around 3 hours on this ensuring it is done to the best of their ability. The documents' focus is to introduce the idea of the PEP to students (part of their NEA in GCSE PE) before they start it after the break.

Any other relevant info?

Please ensure that preparation for end of topic tests and mock exams is the best it can be at home as this will help validate current grades as the year progresses.

GCSE PE 2021 exam series update – two practical activities to be assessed instead of three – all evidence is to be recorded.

Sport Science

What is the plan for Year 11 curriculum time?

Currently completing Technology in Sport assignment (deadline half term).

Ongoing revision for Injuries in sport exam unit embedded in lessons (Students usually start a 2 hour lesson with a set of exam questions which we then walk/talk through).

After half term students will revisit Applying Principles of Training Unit and ensure this (as a compulsory unit) is completed to a good standard. Currently waiting for guidance from OCR regarding any amendments to assessment before we start the final unit on Nutrition in Sport.

Homework preparation is a revision booklet on Injuries in Sport to prepare students for the January exam. On alternative weeks students are giving a section of a past exam paper to complete for the next lesson, which we then walk and talk through in class.

Exam: Monday 11th January 2021

Is a revision guide needed?

No, students will be provided with a number of revision guides and resources for the exam in January.

What work should my child be completing during the 2-week October half-term?

The revision booklet on Show My Homework states clearly what they should be covering over half term.
